
What a blessing these presentations were! As each director shared their plans with clear goals and objectives, I couldn't help but reflect what great work they are doing to help our Conference bring in One More.

ACTIONS TAKEN AT 4.29.21 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Administration update

- Rodney Mills, UCC vice president for administration, shared that during the month of March, Minner Labrador, UCC president; Allee Currier, UCC vice president for finance; and himself scheduled time to meet individually with each pastor. Despite the current restrictions churches have been working with, many great opportunities for ministry have occurred.
- Pastor Slavik Ostapenko shared a report from his highly successful Youtube ministry. Based on analytics from the past year, videos from his small Slavic-speaking church in Spokane have received more than 60 million impressions, resulting in more than 280 thousand views. Sermons from his church have received more than 55 thousand viewing hours.
- Pastor Jason Worf gave a report of a couple that recently moved to Idaho who discovered an Adventist book during their move. Through many God-led incidents, the couple are currently scheduled to be baptized this Spring.
- It was voted to approve the minutes of the February 25, 2021, Executive Committee.

Financial update

- Allee Currier, UCC vice president for finance, presented an update on conference finances.
- God has continued to bless the work in the Conference as tithe has experienced an 18 percent increase compared first quarter of 2020.
- The 2019 General Conference Auditing Service Report was presented, showing that "the overall financial statements are fairly represented." This is an excellent report and demonstrates that our accounting practices are within policy with no significant adjustments needed.
- It was voted to approve the minutes of the April 28, 2021, Administrative and Finance Committee.

- It was voted to receive the January, February, and March 2021 Finance Reports, subject to audit.
- It was voted to receive the 2019 General Conference Auditing Service Report to Governance.
- It was voted to accept the minutes of the April 1, 2021 Financial & Statistical Review Committee.

Education update

- Brian Harris, UCC vice president for education, gave an update on current enrollment and personnel changes across the conference for the 2021-2022 school year.
- Enrollment across the conference is strong. There are currently 42 more students enrolled in school than the Conference had as of October 1.
- Schools across the conference are forecasting substantial growth for the 2021-2022 school year.
- The education department is deep into personnel season, working to rehire more than 150 administrators, teachers and staff members. One significant change is for the position of principal at Upper Columbia Academy, as Eric Johnson has decided to move into health care work on the East Coast.
- It was voted to acknowledge Eric Johnson and the work he has done during his time as principal of Upper Columbia Academy.
- Eric Johnson gave a report on Upper Columbia Academy. Students and staff are back on campus with no further positive cases of COVID, following an outbreak upon return from spring break.
- Conference administration has authorized the use of the camp meeting big tent for the spring music concerts, gymnastics home show, and graduation weekend activities.
- Enrollment for the 2021-2022 school year at Upper Columbia Academy looks strong with 233 currently registered. Enrollment will be capped at 275 students to ensure the best student-to-staff ratio.
